# PROTOCOLS FOR RESUMPTION OF CHURCH GATHERINGS DURING COVID-19 PANDEMIC FROM THE OFFICE OF BISHOP MARK SEITZ

Based upon the swiftly rising numbers of hospitalizations in El Paso County, the decision has been made to keep our church buildings closed and limit gatherings for the time being in El Paso and its surrounding towns. The overarching concern is that we do whatever we can to minimize opportunities for the virus to spread among our people in our churches.

## PHASED PLAN TO RESUME CHURCH GATHERINGS

When the time is appropriate, churches in the Diocese of El Paso will resume gatherings in a phased manner. **All phases have in common the strict following of the Disinfection and Social Distancing norms listed below.**

**Suspended Status:** This is the current status quo throughout the diocese: Church gatherings are limited to just those necessary to facilitate the celebration or live-streaming of Mass, not to exceed 10 people. **Churches in El Paso remain at the Suspended Status.**

**Phase 1:** Church gatherings remain limited to less than 10 people.

**Phase 2:** Churches may resume gatherings at 25% capacity for Mass on weekdays, baptisms, weddings, funerals, Eucharistic exposition for 1–2 hours, and prayer during the day. Sunday Masses remain suspended in this phase.

**Phase 3:** Churches may resume gatherings for Sunday Mass at 25% capacity.

**Phase 4:** Churches may expand gatherings to 50% capacity.

**Phase 5:** Disinfection and Social Distancing norms are relaxed, and churches may expand gatherings to 100% capacity.

## SOCIAL DISTANCING NORMS FOR CHURCHES

- Faithful keep at least 6 feet of separation between parties at all times everywhere on church property.
- It is recommended that there be only one entrance used to enter the church.
- Every other pew in the church should be blocked off with rope or tape
- Lines 6 feet apart should be marked in the aisles to facilitate social distancing during the Communion Procession
- Smaller spaces in which it would be difficult to maintain social distancing, such as cry rooms, should be closed.
- Once the church reaches 25% or 50% capacity (depending on the phase), it may be necessary for hospitality ministers to close the doors of the church and turn people away
- All in the church age 2 or above — parishioners, ministers, volunteers, and clergy — must wear masks or fabric face coverings and avoid physical contact.
- During Mass, clergy should not wear a mask or face covering except when distributing Communion. Lectors should remove their mask or face covering when proclaiming the Word at the ambo. Cantors and other music ministers may remove masks or face coverings while singing, so long as social distancing is strictly observed.
- **Physical contact should be avoided.**
- Gifts of bread and wine should not be brought forward in procession, but should simply be brought from the credence table.
- Distribution of Communion to the assembly will be **limited to the species of bread.**
- Communion may be distributed only by a priest, deacon, or seminarian who is an instituted acolyte, all who must wear a mask or face covering to distribute Communion.
- Reception of Communion should be only in the hand.
- Holy water fonts **should remain empty.**
- Processions of the Eucharist, of relics, of images of saints, or for Corpus Christi, for example are not permitted in any part of the diocese at the present time.

## CLEANING AND DISINFECTING NORMS FOR CHURCHES

- In order for a church to resume gatherings, personnel and supplies must be available to properly **disinfect** all surfaces that the people have touched **after every Mass or service.** This includes door handles, railings, pews, prie-dieus, sacristy areas, and bathroom fixtures. Hard surfaces should be wiped with antibacterial wipes. Upholstered seats should be sprayed with a disinfectant. Disposable gloves should be used while cleaning.
- Parish staff members and volunteers **must be trained** in how to properly disinfect surfaces after every Mass.
- Because they are difficult to sanitize after every Mass, **hymnals and misallettes should be removed from pews.** Hymn lyrics can be printed in disposable worship aids or projected in the church. If hymnals must be used, it is recommended that they be made available at the church entrance, and immediately sanitized when returned at the end of Mass.
- **Collection boxes or one large basket** where the faithful can deposit their offering should be used instead of collection baskets that are passed from person to person. Parishioners should continue to be encouraged to use online forms of giving.
- It is highly recommended that **hand sanitizer stations** be placed at every entrance and that the people use them when entering the church.
- Pastors may, at their discretion, adjust the schedule of Masses on Sundays to allow additional time for proper cleaning and disinfection in between Masses.

**If a church cannot be sanitized according to the Cleaning and Disinfection norms, church gatherings may not resume there. Similarly, if a liturgical celebration or event cannot maintain the Social Distancing norms, it may not take place.** These norms grant permission to pastors to resume church gatherings, but prudential decisions will need to be made once Bishop Seitz makes the decision to move into whatever phase deemed fit at the time. Then a Pastor can decide locally in each parish whether they can be implemented.
